This past year has been nothing short of remarkable, and we at APPLE Schools are delighted to share with you the impact your support has had on the lives of children in our communities.

Student Reach

Your continued support has been instrumental in driving our success and enabling us to reach new heights. APPLE Schools now supports more than 33,000 students in over 100 school communities - which means this year we were able to support over 3,000 NEW students. **Because of your commitment, these 3,000 students** are now moving more, making healthier choices, and feeling empowered to lead healthier lives.

Regional and Provincial Expansions

This year, we expanded our reach to new regions and provinces, including southern Alberta (Calgary and Medicine Hat) and Ontario. That's right - starting this fall, APPLE

Schools will be in six new schools in Oshawa and Whitby, part of the Durham District School Board in the Greater Toronto Area. We've also bolstered our presence in Fort McMurray and Edmonton, ensuring that more children have access to the resources and support they need to thrive.

Scalability Achievement

We are thrilled to announce that we have surpassed our "Scalerator" goal ahead of schedule! Our aspiration to reach 100 schools by 2026 is now a reality a few years early, thanks to the dedication and commitment of each of our partners and stakeholders.

APPLE in Action - Stories from our Schools



At a recent APPLE Schools support meeting, **Richard Secord School** in **Edmonton** shared inspiring results from a recent survey: their students feel respected and heard. This is a notable achievement for a school that faced significant student conflict last year. By focusing on creating a positive social environment, they introduced weekly classroom meetings where students could voice their opinions and concerns.

These meetings helped foster a sense of respect and value among students and staff. The positive feedback energized the school community, and they eagerly participated in Pink Shirt Day this year to demonstrate their commitment to kindness, acceptance, and inclusivity.

This spring, the **Fort McMurray** Public School Division (FMPSD) hosted its second annual **Dene Hand Games** tournament, co-led by the APPLE School Health Mentor and the Health Champion from **Westwood Community High School**.

This event celebrates Dene culture and introduces students to a new form of physical activity. Nearly every school in FMPSD participated, along with others from the region including some **Fort McMurray** Catholic schools, **Anzac**, **Fort McKay**, **Janvier**, and **Fort Chipewyan**. Each school had a Dene hand games coach supported by the APPLE Schools Health Mentor. This event was a fantastic example of how comprehensive school health can be infused into the cultural contexts of a region.
